In Inquiry, we have been working on researching famous European explorers. We have been aiming to find out the continents they discovered and routes they sailed.



NAPLAN

We are currently in the midst of NAPLAN testing. Grade 3 and 5 students this morning completed the Reading assessment which followed on from yesterday's Writing and Language Conventions tests. Tomorrow, the testing period concludes with the Numeracy assessment. After being cancelled last year due to remote learning being in place, this year's results will give a great deal of insight into the impacts the adjusted 2020 school year has had on our students' learning.

Attendance

Thank you to those families following guidelines and keeping their child home from school when they are unwell. 
