



The Woolworths Earn and Learn


Thank you everyone for collecting these tokens for our school.


The Woolworths Earn & Learn program helps schools and early learning centres obtain a variety of educational resources, including sporting, mathematics, arts, science and technology equipment.


Please join us for an exciting new community event for Willowmavin Primary School – our inaugural Bonfire Night!
